



Overleaf: The Sawtooth range is seen beyond Little Redfish Lake in the Sawtooth National Recreation Area near Stanley.




Lilacs go from buds to blooms. Serviceberries ripen in August.

A tiny orange-crowned warbler rests on the deck in August. Members of the Idaho Birding group on Facebook helped identify the bird. Left, rhubarb grows and flowers in the yard. Three plants yielded rhubarb crisp and other treats throughout the spring. We were warned that there are a two times a year here when you lock your doors and roll up the car windows: zucchini season and rhubarb season.





The stub of a tree trunk at Little Redfish Lake near Stanley is peppered with small holes. Back in Salmon, firewood is ready for cold weather. Spiked wood is seen on a corral rail. At right, dramatic clouds cross the Continental Divide.













Sacajawea Interpretive, Cultural and Educational Center in Salmon offers walking trails through the park and along the Lemhi River. Upper left, a trailside boulder shows multiple colors and textures. One of several horses, this one with a distinctive backside, grazes in its pen. Clouds float over the frame of a tepee. Interpretive signs tell visitors about Sacajawea and the Agai'dika Shoshone-Bannock people who lived in the area.
