
Water from Henry's Fork of the Snake River ripples over jagged triangular pieces of rock at the Upper Coffeepot campground in Island Park, Idaho.

Pictographs adorn rocks along the Salmon River Road (Forest Road 030) in Lemhi County. An interpretive sign reads: The pictographs (drawings) on the rock wall ... were made with crushed, iron-rich earth and a binder, such as animal fat. They may have recorded the sacred dreams of a shaman (religious leader), or may have been signs telling others about local resources, or have illustrated the tribe's history.
